

Keep learning when school is closed

Wherever you are in the world, the ability to carry on the process of teaching and learning when school is closed is of great importance. Schools from Cairo to London are relying on Firefly Cloud to keep them operational even when no-one can make it in and without depending on the school's physical infrastructure or internet connection.

Performance

Our cloud is optimised by our infrastructure experts to be finely tuned to Firefly itself. As a result, page loading is fast and setting work is quick. We also know, for example, that most parents and students are active on Firefly between 7pm and 8pm when they are most likely not to be on school premises. Hosting in the cloud always offers a better experience at these particularly busy times. Firefly's advanced load balanced infrastructure means that peaks in demand can be managed which would otherwise cause a slowdown on a single local server.

Reliability

Our uptime figure in Q1 of 2017 has been 99.98%. This is a figure that is unachievable on a local server that is kept fully up to date with security updates and operating system patches.

Firefly Cloud is monitored and supported around the clock by teams based in London and Sydney and does not rely on your school IT support responding out of hours.

We are able to scale resources when schools are busiest, for example at the beginning of a new term or in exam season. We've prepared an accompanying document that gives more detailed information on how we ensure Firefly's reliability in the cloud in a way that just isn't possible in the local version of Firefly.

Achieve more with Firefly and cloud only features

Firefly Cloud offers our development team opportunities to use technologies that simply can't be supported locally. In fact, we have just released our first cloudonly features. Annotation, a core Firefly 6 feature that teachers are enjoying on Firefly for Teachers on iOS is now available in the browser for cloud schools.

Better integration

Your current MIS integration will continue to work with Firefly Cloud. Our next generation MIS integration, including writeback and analytics functionality is only possible on cloud.

We can test and deploy new code faster

We already have the ability to deploy bug fixes to the cloud in minutes. Once all our schools are in the cloud, we will be able to test and deploy new features more quickly as we remove the need to duplicate testing for installers and local configurations.

Moving to the cloud

Many schools have already migrated to Firefly Cloud. We will guide you every step of the way. Although there are some complexities, we are well practiced and will make it easy for you and your team. You need to pick a time when a small amount of downtime is acceptable and when your technical team are on hand. For your users, the only thing that will change is the URL.

The great news is that there is no extra charge to be hosted in Firefly Cloud. Your annual licensing will not necessarily change. In fact, in addition to the savings from Microsoft licensing, server and storage costs, some schools may additionally save money by moving to the cloud. There is a migration fee payable part in advance that covers all the work required to get you up and running quickly and smoothly.
